MOVING FORWARD TOGETHER WITH EU EXPERTISE

Aim of the Workshop:

The workshop is part of our engagement in the auspices of the Environmental Compliance and Governance Forum and aims at ensuring involvement of various stakeholders to widen the perspective.

The Forum was established as a high-level Commission Expert Group by Commission Decision C(2018)10 at the same time as the adoption of the Commission's Action Plan on environmental compliance assurance – see COM (2018)10. The Forum serves as a platform for strategic exchanges with Member States and networks of environmental enforcement professionals on environmental governance issues, including combating environmental crime. The Forum is composed of representatives of Member States and representatives of European networks of compliance assurance practitioners and authorities, particularly environment agencies.

The aim of the workshop is to discuss with a wider audience issues related to ensuring environmental compliance, in particular combating environmental crime and the proposal for a new Environmental Crime Directive. This Commission proposal is currently being negotiated in the Council and the European Parliament.

Another issue which will be addressed is strengthening environmental compliance through the implementation of the Zero Pollution Action Plan. The workshop will cover compliance assurance and enforcement related aspects linked to ensuring Zero Pollution objectives. The aim is to discuss and possibly agree on next steps and possible concrete cooperation activities to help enhance consistency of enforcement efforts cross policy areas.

The meeting will gather the experience and good practices that have been identified at the Member State level. It will bring together representatives from environmental authorities of the Member States, providing an opportunity to discuss challenges and remaining obstacles at national, regional and local levels.
