Legal psychological studies into child sexual abuse investigations in Indonesia: The role of child investigative interviewing

1. A science-based child forensic interview leads to the most accurate and detailed statements in children. (This thesis)
2. Irrelevant background information about an alleged victim of child sexual abuse can adversely affect judgments and decision-making processes in police investigators. (This thesis)
3. Police investigators tend to underestimate the negative effects of authority on children's statements and overestimate their ability to detect lying in children. (This thesis)
4. Suspect confessions and the medicolegal evidence are universal factors leading to the prosecution of child sexual abuse cases. (This thesis)
5. The use of a science-based interview, such as the NICHD interview protocol, should be the gold standard when interviewing alleged child victims of abuse.
