- 1. Elderly patients should not be withheld optimal curative treatment based on older age or the presence of comorbidities alone *this thesis*
- 2. While older age does not preclude a restorative resection, a permanent end colostomy should always be discussed in elderly rectal cancer patients *this thesis*
