Understanding Patient Perspectives Online Access to Medical Records

- 1. Online access will not substantially reduce financial pressures on the health care system. | this dissertation
- 2. Introducing online access poses the risk of disadvantaging patients with lower health literacy and digital skills. | this dissertation
- 3. Healthcare providers must document information in medical records in a way that patients can understand. | this dissertation
- 4. To make an informed decision about whether to use online access, patients need information on how it can impact their participation in healthcare and the patient-provider relationship. | this dissertation
- 5. Future efforts to support the implementation of online access should highlight privacy safeguards, ensure accessibility of records, and enhance comprehensibility of medical information.
- 6. Non-digital options should be offered as equal alternatives to digital care innovations for all aspects of patients' healthcare management.
- 7. The benefits of conducting a needs assessment of the priority population before implementing a health promotion intervention outweigh the costs.
- 8. We need comprehensive theories to generate synergistic interaction between informed decision-making principles and health promotion strategies.
