- 1. Health related quality of life in patients with a Barretts' esophagus is comparable to an age- and gender-matched general population (this thesis).
- 2. Patients with high cancer worry have a more negative illness perception regarding the diagnosis of Barrett esophagus (this thesis).
- 3. The physician-patient relationship is the soul of health care; patient trust and effective communication is a fundamental aspect of that relationship (this thesis).
- 4. Barretts' esophagus patients with reflux and dyspepsia symptoms are more likely to overestimate their risk for developing an esophageal adenocarcinoma (this thesis).
