Social participation in dementia

Experiences and the role of technology through an occupational lens

- 1. Social participation is a dynamic concept with many aspects, of which at the moment, at best, only partial aspects are measured. (this dissertation)
- 2. The concept of the shrinking world unnecessarily contributes to the stigma surrounding dementia and should therefore be revised. (this dissertation)
- 3. Maintaining independence in social participation paradoxically requires people with dementia to accept support from others. (this dissertation)
- 4. There is insufficient evidence of the effectiveness of technological interventions in improving social participation among people with dementia. (this dissertation)
- 5. Fostering social participation for people with dementia involves adjusting familiar environments and activities, rather than creating new settings and activities exclusively for people with dementia.
- 6. The involvement of an occupational therapist should be an integral part of care for everyone diagnosed with dementia.
- 7. The rapid evolution of technology limits the effectiveness of traditional research designs, like Randomized Controlled Trials (RCTs), in providing up-to-date and high-quality evidence.
- 8. The potential of technology in dementia highlighted in research contrasts with its real-world application in the daily lives of people with dementia.
- 9. The key to advancing research often comes in the form of a cup of coffee.
