Enhancing relationship-centered care in nursing homes

1. In de verpleeghuiszorg gaat het om relatiegerichte zorg en niet persoonsgerichte zorg. (dit proefschrift)
2. In het verpleeghuis is narratieve data noodzakelijk om de dagelijkse zorg voor ouderen te verbeteren. (dit proefschrift)
3. Het reflecteren op het eigen handelen door zorgverleners is onvoldoende ontwikkeld in de verpleeghuiszorg. (dit proefschrift)
4. De COVID-pandemie heeft laten zien dat relatiegerichte zorg niet verankerd is in de dagelijkse praktijk van de verpleeghuiszorg. (dit proefschrift)
5. Om gelijkwaardige relaties binnen de zorgdriehoek te bevorderen, moet het denken in termen van "wij" versus "zij" worden doorbroken.
6. Een gelijkwaardige samenwerking tussen bewoners, familieleden en zorgmedewerkers is cruciaal om de kloof tussen de stijgende zorgvraag en het arbeidsmarkttekort in de toekomst te verkleinen.
7. De goede intenties van zorgmedewerkers zijn belangrijk, maar het zijn de acties en hun gevolgen die uiteindelijk tellen.
8. Het generiek kompas geeft zorgorganisaties de kans om relatiegerichte zorg in de praktijk te implementeren.

1. In nursing home care, it is about relationship-centered care, not person-centered care. (this dissertation)
2. In the nursing home, narrative data is essential for improving the daily care of the residents. (this dissertation)
3. Reflection on their own actions by caregivers is insufficiently developed in nursing home care. (this dissertation)
4. The COVID pandemic has shown that relationship-centered care is not embedded in the daily practice of nursing home care. (this dissertation)
5. To promote equal relationships within the care triad, the "us" versus "them" mindset must be overcome.
6. An equal partnership between residents, family members and care staff is crucial to bridging the gap between the increasing demand for care and future workforce shortages.
7. The good intentions of care staff are important, but it is the actions and their outcomes that ultimately matter.
8. The generic compass provides care organizations the opportunity to implement relationship-centered care in practice.
