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1. Gezondheidsbevordering verdient een plaats in de kerndoelen van het onderwijs (*dit proefschrift*).
2. Intersectorale samenwerking is essentieel voor de implementatie van de Gezonde School (*dit proefschrift*)?
3. Verandermanagement, dat zich uit in de rol van de regiocoördinatoren en hun ondernemingsgeest, is onmisbaar om vanuit enthousiasme over de Gezonde School tot collectieve actie te komen (*dit proefschrift*).
4. Het DISC model kan nuttig gebruikt worden door regiocoördinatoren om intersectorale samenwerking op een systematische manier binnen de Gezonde School vorm te geven, mits ze over voldoende expertise beschikken op het vlak van planmatige organisatieverandering, organisatiegedrag, coalitievorming en groepsdynamica (*dit proefschrift*).
5. Met een ongemeten maat kan niet de mate van succes worden gemeten (*valorisatie addendum*).
6. Een onderzoeksopzet bestaande uit een combinatie van databronnen en analysemethoden is het meest geschikt voor onderzoek op het gebied van van de Gezonde School en intersectorale samenwerking in de volksgezondheid (*valorisatie addendum*).
7. Because the implementation of comprehensive programs is flawed, efforts in this area discredit health promotion interventions more than they contribute to the achievement of population health gains (*adapted from Deschesnes et al. 2003 | Badura, 1998*)
8. Collaboration does not mean that everyone has to agree on the best possible solution, it only means that they have to be willing to support the decision once it is made (*Thomson and Perry, 2006, p. 24*).
9. Optimismus spielt manchmal die entscheidende Rolle, wenn Personen, Institutionen oder Organisationen freiwillig Risiken eingehen (*adapted from Daniel Kahneman*).
